**ARTS IN SCHOOLS WRAP UP  
ANOTHER YEAR  
OF ENJOYMENT FOR STUDENTS**

This past school year we served 28,604 young people – a 22% increase over last year. This is made possible thanks to the great support of the community, our successful “An Elegant Affaire” fundraiser and business and foundation grants. The San Francisco Foundation granted us funds to give additional support to the school’s share of the cost last year to make it more affordable and to enable more students to participate. These funds were expended very quickly and were distributed on a first come basis. Our very talented artists performed 96 assemblies in 28 schools in Fremont, Newark and Union City.
