Gladys Davidson a long time supporter of LOV and an avid bingo player. For some time she has wanted to see LOV’s broken-down bingo machine replaced, but knew we could never afford to purchase a new one. So to get the ball rolling, Gladys - supported by her family who knew how important LOV was in her life – followed her dream.

At a bingo night in May, Gladys presented a \$5,000 check to LOV Board President, **Donna Sisk**. Knowing a new machine would cost at least \$10,000 or more – and that LOV’s general fund could not cover the balance, Donna announced Gladys’ donation and asked if anyone wanted to donate \$100 or more and get their name on a plaque on the machine to raise their hands. Hands went up all over the room and \$3,500 was donated that night alone. Over the next several weeks, many other donations came in. – including LOV’s supplier, **Bingo Vision**, who donated the machine for cost only, including the shipping. On June 28 at a gala pre-bingo party, Gladys, wearing a crown and a special tee shirt with the photo of the machine, unveiled a state of the art bingo machine with 40 donor plaques on it and in big letters the name – ‘GLADYS’.

A SUMMER OF FUN

PARKS KIDS ENJOY 6 WEEKS OF FUN – It was LOV’s **29th year** of providing FREE supervised recreation. This year a record 5,160 participants from Newark, Fremont and Union City had a terrific summer at Mayhews Landing and Civic Center parks. **This was a 26% increase over last year!** There were new experiences and the making of new friendships. The kids loved the many games, sports activities and arts & crafts projects. New and very special to the young people this year was kite day. With the help of volunteers they assembled a multitude of colorful kites and just had a ball getting them to fly. This was a new experience for most of them and the joy on their faces was priceless. Kite day made up for the fact that we couldn’t provide a field trip. To do so would mean dedicated sponsorships which we were unable to obtain. With as many children as we had – it would have meant hiring 3 buses, instead of the usual 2. The cost was prohibitive – as fees are much higher now because of the cost of fuel.

Program Director, **Joanne Paletta**, arranged for some special guest visits. Coming to share their experiences and talents were:

- **The Newark Fire Department brought their ladder truck and talked about safety and the work of a firefighter. All the kids received a red firefighter’s helmet**
- **Alan Kahn brought his special magic show**
- **The Oakland Knowland Zoo brought the Zoo Mobile and a lot of “creepy critters”**
